Treating environment is key

The weather is starting to warm up and that, encourages the spread of fleas. Certainly, in areas with a more temperate climate, fleas can be a year-round problem.

Many pets may have fleas and are not particularly bothered, but for a pet that is flea allergic, it can be an excruciating condition. A good start to help your pet avoid fleas is to control and treat your environment.

Inside the house, vacuum frequently and especially the areas where pets sleep and under furniture to remove flea eggs.

Borate powders: Often found under the brand name Fleabusters[®], these powders are applied to indoor carpets that will result in an environment that will dehydrate fleas and other pests. Please follow all guidelines when applying.

Fleas enjoy a moist environment, so try to remove leaves and other organic debris covering moist ground to allow it to dry. Additionally, keep vegetation near the home or

kennel mowed or clipped. Keep the area free of carrier hosts such as free roaming cats and dogs, raccoons, squirrels and opossums.

Predatory nematodes: If you are interested in an outdoor-use organic method, consider predatory nematodes. These are microscopic "worms" that prey on numerous insect pests that have a larval stage in the soil. They are safe for humans and animals, so they are an especially good option for outdoor areas frequented by you and your pet.

Insecticides: This group includes pyrethrins, and synthetic pyrethroids. They are available through professional exterminators as well as at hardware stores for self application. Be sure to follow all cautionary guidelines when applying these products. Finally, insect growth regulators (pyriproxyfen) are another option. It does not kill adult fleas, but prevents eggs from hatching, breaking the infestation cycle.

The science and formulations of topical and oral anti-flea medications continue to evolve, so consult with your veterinarian for the best product for your pet.

Animal Derm Clinic Doctor Diverted by Japan Earthquake

Dr. Wayne Rosenkrantz (Tustin, CA) was en route to Tokyo, Japan on March 11 when his flight was diverted fifteen minutes before landing due to an earthquake.

The event, of course, was the massive 8.9-magnitude earthquake and deadly tsunami that struck the coastal town of Sendai 165 miles away. Although Tokyo was spared from the disaster, it was unknown at the time if the runways were affected and the plane landed 500 miles north in the city of Sapporo. It resulted in a 22- hour trip.

Dr. Rosenkrantz, an international speaker, was invited to lecture to a group of veterinarians in two cities that weekend. On Saturday, he made his way back to Tokyo arriving as the conference was ending. He was able to speak on Sunday in Osaka.

Japan offers world-class public transportation, both in comfort and efficiency, yet the earthquake disrupted travel plans for many. Dr. Rosenkrantz says he was fortunate to find trains running when he needed them but he learned later that many had cancelled service immediately afterwards.

While in Japan, Dr. Rosenkrantz says he did experience aftershocks, including some measuring greater than magnitude of 6.0 which even for this California native, it was quite a jolt.

He returned home safely on March 14.
